JCCC is a host institution for this year's Global Conference on Sustainability in Higher Education, a virtual professional development event. This year's conference, with a theme of "Mobilizing for a Just Transition," will focus on centering justice and leaving no one behind in the transition from an extractive economy to a regenerative economy.

In addition to serving as a host institution for 2020, JCCC faculty, staff, and students have participated and presented for over a decade at AASHE conferences. Many of the sustainability-related improvements you see at JCCC grew out of the Student Sustainability Committee's participation in the conference through the years. JCCC is also a Silver-rated institution by the AASHE Sustainability Tracking, Assessment, and Rating System (STARS), and staff in the Center for Sustainability serve in various leadership roles with AASHE.

AASHE sessions are listed [here](#), and you can sort them by topic if you click the “Category” list. Some topics include: Diversity and Affordability, Campus Engagement and Culture, Wellbeing and Work, along with several others.

AASHE has also packaged its sessions into seven tracks, also included in the “Category” list. Selecting a track will return 12-20 sessions curated for their related content. Brief track descriptions are below:

Campus Operations: addressing sustainability impacts created by the construction, operation and management of campus facilities and grounds.

Culture & Communications: focused on efforts to cultivate a sustainability-oriented culture on campus.

Emerging Issues: sessions on authentic inclusion, advancing food security and climate action during a pandemic, equity in online learning, and redefining sustainability to meet the moment.

Governance & Administration: related to institutional leadership for sustainability.

Public Outreach & Engagement: sessions concerning development of relationships between higher education institutions and external entities such as local community groups, employers, and government bodies at all levels.

Racial Equity & Social Justice: sessions [focused](#) on the advancement of racial equity and social justice within higher education.

Student Organizing & Activism: developing student leadership for sustainability, presented by students and student organizers.

Teaching & Learning: focused on pedagogy, content and leadership for sustainability education.
